

Poverty: Living with Less Than Enough (Ethics and Concerns)

This program addresses the causes and cures of poverty. Licensees will be asked to examine their thinking about impoverished people and what it takes to raise them out of poverty. Participants will leave with a myriad of ideas as to how to assist impoverished people in the workplace (including some staff members) and community to attain sustained self-sufficiency.

- Empathize with the hopeless situations created by poverty.
- Compare and contrast the resources available to people living in poverty, middle and wealth classes.
- Examine barriers to open communication about economic status.
- Consider innovative solutions to poverty that create sustained selfsufficiency and upward economic progress.
- Develop an action-plan, whether grand or small to confront poverty in your community or on your caseload.
